Divine Mercy Sunday
April 23, 2017

My dear brothers and sisters in Christ,

Again, our Holy Week celebrations were incredibly beautiful! Thank you all for participating, and thank you all who made them possible! A special congratulations to Chrystian Wheeling who was baptized, confirmed and received her first Eucharist at the Easter Vigil this year as well as to Eric Bradburn, Ashley Baker and Eric Miles who made their Profession of Faith in the Church, were confirmed and received their first Eucharist. In this period of Mystagogia, as the mysteries are unfolded before them, they will continue to be in our prayers! Let us all pray for one another!

Today's first reading from the Acts of the Apostles has one of those verses we Catholics should know by memory. The disciples "devoted themselves to the teachings of the apostles, to the communal life, to the breaking of the bread and to the prayers." Isn't this amazing? Teaching, fellowship, bread and prayers: Catholics, both in ancient Jerusalem right from the beginning and here at St. Mary's this very weekend, hold to the catechesis or instruction of the apostles, to friendship and mutual support, to the celebration of the most Holy Eucharist and to communal praise and petitions!

Such characteristics illustrate that just as the earliest believers were united as a family, so are we today. But the Church also teaches us that such unity is not broken by death. We who live here and now are inseparably linked with those who have died. In fact, those who are alive in Christ can do more for us now in prayer than even while they lived on earth. Through God's mercy, we are given the support of the Communion of Saints on our pilgrimage through this life. For this reason, it was so wonderful to celebrate our Mass of Remembrance this past Wednesday, to remember our loved ones, to pray for them and to ask for their prayers.


St. Peter speaks of God's love and mercy for us in our second reading today when he says, "Blessed be the God and Father of our Lord Jesus Christ, who in His great mercy, gave us a new birth to a living hope through the Resurrection of Jesus Christ from the dead." Through His mercy, we have every reason for hope, for He has revealed His power, His glory and the depths of His love for us.

Finally, in our Gospel, it is an act of pure mercy, that after revealing to them His body, Jesus gives us the Sacrament of Reconciliation. "He breathed on them and said to them, 'Receive the Holy Spirit. Whose sins you forgive are forgiven them, and whose sins you retain are retained.'" Through this sacrament, His mercy is endless and the treasury of His compassion inexhaustible. And so, on this Divine Mercy Sunday, let us pray with Saint Faustina, "Jesus, I trust in you."


