

Third Sunday of Easter
April 30, 2017

My dear brothers and sisters in Christ,

Today's Gospel takes us back to Easter Sunday. Two disciples are going to a village named Emmaus, and Jesus, although unrecognized, walks with them. They were sad, for their hopes have been destroyed and their faith was crushed. Notice the past tense in what Cleopas says, "We had hoped that Jesus was the One to redeem Israel." Even though they knew about the empty tomb and about the women's vision of angels who said He was alive, still they didn't believe as they once did. Cleopas refers to Jesus simply as a great prophet, no longer calling Him the "Messiah," the "Son of God," or even the "One who is to come." As Jews, they knew the Scriptures. The problem is not that they didn't know the prophets, but rather that they didn't believe them! Lacking faith, they're walking away.

So Jesus meets them where they are and offers them a Scripture lesson that they would never forget. "Beginning with Moses and the prophets, He interpreted to them what referred to Him in all the Scriptures." In other words, before giving them the Gospel, He begins with the Old Testament. Why is this important for us? It's important for us because that's where we usually begin our Liturgy of the Word every week at Mass. In order to understand the Gospel, we need to know how the Old Testament prefigures, points towards and is fulfilled in the New Testament. Just as it was this teaching that sets their hearts on fire, so it is that this teaching from the Old Testament, fulfilled in the New, that prepares us to recognize Him in the *Breaking of the Bread*.


One of the problems we have today is that all too often we only read and study the New Testament. As a result, we don't see how the New Testament is hidden in the Old and the Old is revealed in the New. Yet all of Jesus' claims that He makes about Himself are validated and vindicated by the prophecies of the Old Testament and the "types" revealed in the Old Testament that He fulfills in Himself, like being the new Adam, the new Moses, and the new David. Just as Jesus evangelizes these two, who had lost their faith due to the scandal of the Cross, through the breaking open of the Word so do we continue this practice in our Liturgy of the Word.

"Stay with us," they beg, and "so He went to stay with them." Just as on Holy Thursday, so too here Jesus "took..., blessed..., broke... and gave the bread." Their eyes were opened, and they recognized Him, but He vanished from their sight." But does He really leave them? No! Like us today, they recognize Him in the *Breaking of the Bread*!

WHAT IS FORTY HOURS DEVOTION?

Traditionally, each parish sets aside three days of the year for the faithful to gather together for personal and public prayer. The focus of these three days is to spend time in adoration of our Lord in the Blessed Sacrament and to reflect on the centrality of the Eucharist in the life of the Church. Although originally forty, today the hours of exposition are adjusted according to the parish's needs.

While the Mass is the central act of worship for us as Catholics, Vatican Council II upheld and encouraged the adoration of the Blessed Sacrament outside of Mass as did Pope John Paul II during the Year of the Eucharist.

During our Eucharistic Devotions, time will be available for private meditation in the presence of the exposed Blessed Sacrament each afternoon. **Sign up for an adoration time in the vestibule of the church.** Each evening at 7:00 pm, we will gather as a community for evening prayer, a Eucharistic meditation, and Benediction of the Blessed Sacrament.



FIRST SUNDAY ADORATION.

The first Sunday of each month, the Blessed Sacrament will be exposed for adoration between the Sunday Masses. Spend some time, even a little, in prayer before Jesus, truly present in the Eucharist. Please observe a reverent silence in the church during Adoration out of respect for Our Lord and your fellow parishioners at prayer.



The next First Sunday Adoration is May 7: the Fourth Sunday of Easter. This is also called "Good Shepherd Sunday." As *Lumen Gentium* reminds us: "The Church is a sheepfold whose one and indispensable door is Christ. It is a flock of which God Himself foretold He would be the shepherd, and whose sheep, although ruled by human shepherds, are nevertheless continuously led and nourished by Christ Himself, the Good Shepherd and the Prince of the shepherds, who gave His life for the sheep" (LG §6). Please take some time to gather around our Shepherd in adoration, especially during our parish's Forty Hours Devotion.

FROM ST. MARY'S ARCHIVES

From "Lancaster Examiner and Herald," August 11, 1852:

"The corner stone of the new English Catholic Church on West Vine Street, this city, was laid on Sunday afternoon at 3 o'clock. The ceremonies were witnessed by a large concourse of our citizens. ...A copy of the following was placed in the stone: 'To the glory of the Almighty and most gracious God. To the honor of the Blessed Virgin Mary of the Assumption, Pius the IXth being sovereign Pontiff, John Nepomucene Newman, Bishop of Philadelphia, and Bernard Keenan, Rector of this congregation, Millard Fillmore being President of the United States, William Bigler Governor of Pennsylvania and Christian Kieffer, Mayor of this city.' ...In the cavity of the corner stone were also placed in a metal box hermetically sealed various coins and a copy of each of the political papers published in Lancaster city, with copies of some of the leading journals of the country. The Rev. Dr. McCaffrey, D.D., President of Mount St. Mary's College preached on the occasion to a very numerous and respectable audience."
