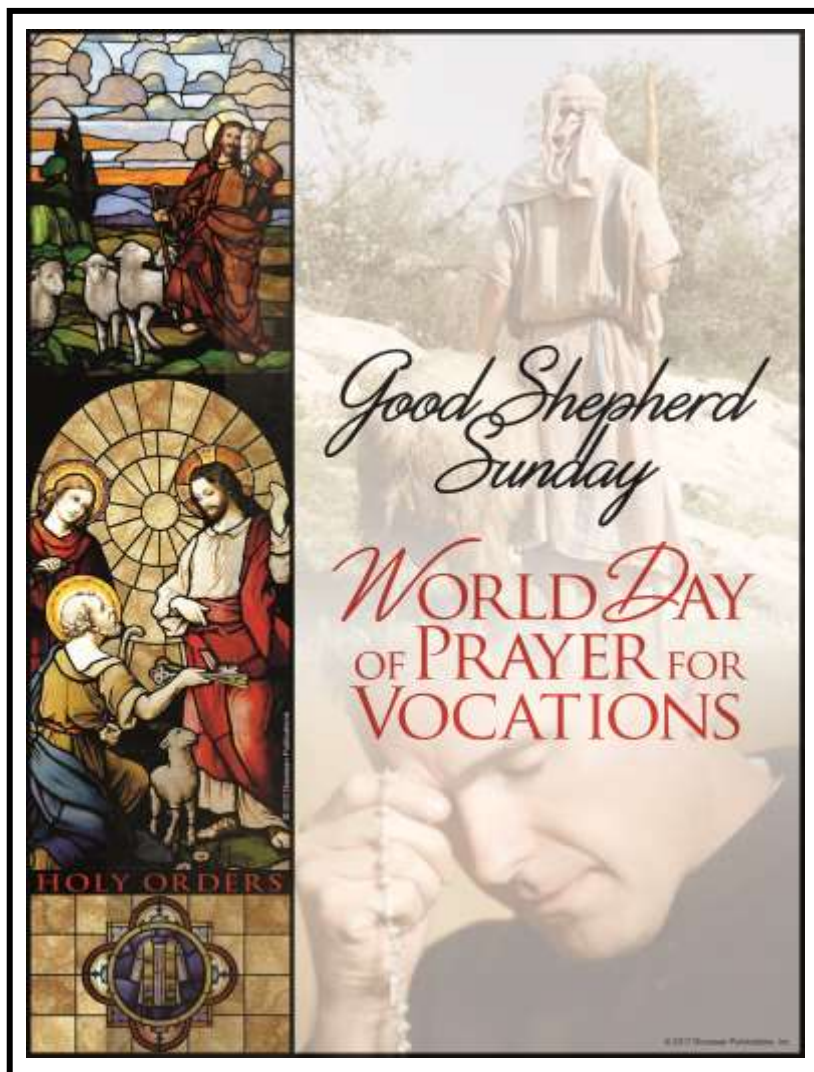

Good Shepherd Sunday
May 7, 2017

My dear brothers and sisters in Christ,

The call of the Good Shepherd leads to the restful waters of Baptism, to the anointing oil of Confirmation, and to the table and overflowing cup of the Eucharist, as we sing in today's Psalm. Again, on this Sunday in Easter, we hear His voice calling us *His own*. May He awaken in us the response of those who heard Peter's preaching, "What are we to do?"

We have been baptized. But each of us can still go astray like sheep, as we hear in today's Epistle. We still need to repent daily, to seek forgiveness of our sins and to separate ourselves further from this corrupt generation. We need the Sacrament of Reconciliation and the true Manna that comes down from heaven, the Eucharist. Truly, we are called to follow in the footsteps of the Shepherd of our souls. Through these sacraments, we are conformed to Him. Through His suffering He bore our sins in His body to free us from sin. But His suffering is also an example for us. For we are called to be His Mystical Body in the world today. From Him we learn patience in our afflictions and how to hand ourselves over to the will of God. Through our sacrifices, we draw others near.

Yes, Jesus not only goes ahead of us to show us the path through the dark valley of evil and death, but through His abiding presence in all who have received Him, He also journeys with us. His Cross has become the narrow gate through which we must pass to reach the verdant pastures of life abundant, the Kingdom of God! Let us give thanks!


A grandmother takes her grandson to the beach. The boy goes out in a boat which tips over. The grandmother starts shouting for help. No one comes. Finally she prays, "Please God, send someone to rescue my grandchild." As if out of nowhere a man appears, dives in the water and brings the boy gasping to shore. The grandmother starts straightening out the boy's wet clothes, then stops, looks up and says, "He had a hat." Seems silly, but we can be silly at times.

God has given us everything, more than we deserve. Instead of constant gratitude, we tend to get upset when one thing goes wrong: getting stuck in traffic, things not going our way, a negative comment, a disappointing meal. This Sunday, God also invites us to reflect on how much we have freely received. "The Lord is my shepherd, there is nothing I shall want." Let us be grateful for the Shepherd of our souls and for all who have been visible shepherds to us. We are not alone; let us listen for His tender voice. He loves us!

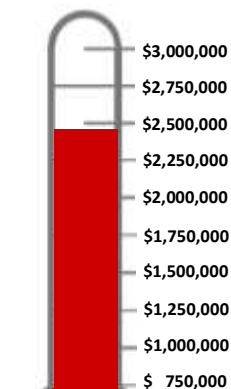
