

My dear brothers and sisters in Christ,

Happy Mother's Day! Along with the secular community, we honor our mothers this weekend, those who are with us and those who have gone before us, for their goodness, generosity, compassion, sacrifices and love. And this is fitting; I love my Mom. But in this month of May, let us also honor the greatest mother of all, my Mom and yours... the Mother given to us at the foot of the Cross, Mary, the Blessed Virgin Mother. Just as we honor our earthy mothers with acts of love, let us honor Mary by turning to her. She'll draw us closer to her beloved Son, and in fact, Jesus gave her to us for this very reason, for we are His beloved disciples!

"Beloved: Come to him, a living stone, rejected by human beings but chosen and precious in the sight of God, and like living stones, let yourselves be built into a spiritual house to be a holy priesthood to offer spiritual sacrifices acceptable to God through Jesus Christ." These are the beautiful opening words of St. Peter to us today in our second reading. He will go on to call us "a chosen race, a royal priesthood, a holy nation, a people of His own, so that you may announce the praises of Him who called you out of darkness into His wonderful light." Yes, we are precious in the eyes of the Lord, invaluable, cherished, highly esteemed, and loved!

But why? Certainly not for anything that we have done on our own, but rather because we are His children. And He loves us for what He has created us to be, members of His Body, to share in His mission and in the life of the Holy Trinity. "Amen, amen, I say to you, whoever believes in me will do the works that I do, and will do greater ones than these," says Jesus in today's Gospel. Really? Yes, this great promise and more is what we explore this weekend.

What a delight to have had Fr. Don Bender preach at our 40 Hours Devotions this year! Each evening Father broke open the Word of God for us in his wonderfully exuberant and insightful way. Over the three nights, he communicated to us the critical need to have a personal relationship with Jesus. Thank you Father! As a Eucharistic people, these devotions are so fruitful to our life of contemplation. Thank you to all those who made our Eucharist Devotions so beautiful.





FROM ST. MARY'S ARCHIVES

From "*Old St. Mary's of Lancaster, Pa.: The Jesuit Period, 1741-1785*" by Edgar A. Musser:

"The most practical route to Lancaster from the shores of the Chesapeake Bay was by way of the Susquehanna and Conestoga Rivers. It had been used by the missionaries of earlier days and, following the method of their predecessors, this was the route that Father Wappeler and Father Schneider [our 1st and 2nd pastors] took in 1741. What kind of boat they boarded we do not know, but they probably landed on the banks of the Conestoga at the site known many years ago as Graeff's Landing. This was at the lower end of South Queen Street (now Engleside) and was, as it remains today, the only practical point of entry into Lancaster from the south. Father Wappeler and Father Schneider then walked into town in search of Thomas Doyle."
